PRAYING SCRIPTURE

“Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever” (Matthew 6:9-13).

Many godly people throughout history have used written prayers in their daily time with the Lord. The prayers in this particular prayer guide follow the sequence Jesus gave us in his model prayer. They are offered as examples of how to take God’s Word and use it for personal prayer.

I think we can safely say that no prayer more accurately reflects the will of God than those which use the language which God himself gives us. No request is more sure to be granted than that which expresses what God himself has promised to fulfill. No petition is more sure to be answered than that which pleads for what God already commands.

“The words of the LORD are pure words, like silver refined in a furnace on the ground, purified seven times” (Psalm 12:6). Learn to use his words in your prayers. Pray the promises and commands of scripture. God assures us that when we pray according to his will, he hears us and will answer our prayers (1 John 5:14-15).¹

Using This Prayer Guide

This book is organized by the seven days of each week. Each day’s prayer guide is divided into six major sections with nine subcategories based on the Lord’s Prayer:

1. Worship/Adoration

- “Our Father” - Our Relationship with God
- “In Heaven” - God’s Royalty
- “Hallowed Be Your Name” - God’s Reputation

2. Intercession

- “Your Kingdom Come” - God’s Reign
- “Your Will Be Done, on Earth as It Is in Heaven” - God’s Rule

3. Supplication

- “Give Us This Day Our Daily Bread” - God’s Resources for Us

4. Confession/Reconciliation

5. Spiritual Warfare

- “And Lead Us Not into Temptation, but Deliver Us from Evil” - God’s Protection

6. Praise and Thanksgiving

- “For Yours Is the Kingdom and the Power and the Glory, Forever” - Praise to God

Spending Time with the Lord

How much time would you like to spend with the Lord? If you meditate and pray for 1 minute from each of the nine sub-categories, that would be 9 minutes. 2 minutes from each category would be 18 minutes. 3 minutes spent on each category would be 27 minutes. Depending on the amount of time you have available, it is easy to spend a refreshing, profitable, and enjoyable 15-30 minutes or more nurturing your relationship with God each day.

How much time you spend in prayer is up to you and the Holy Spirit. The more you learn to enjoy prayer the more time you will want to spend with God. What has impressed me most by using this prayer guide is how much more meaningful, enjoyable, and scriptural my prayer time has become. I hope that will be your experience too.

Do Not Rush through the Prayer Guide

This prayer guide is designed to help you learn how to use scripture as a guide for your prayer time—time spent talking with God. As you pray through this book, think about what the scripture passages are teaching about God, about us, and about loving and forgiving our fellow man. Meditate on the promises. Do not allow your prayer time to become mechanical or routine.

Fully engage your mind and heart as you pray. Ask God to help you to focus on each word with heartfelt sincerity and earnestness. Feel free to pause any time in a prayer and add your own thoughts. Learn how to pour out your heart to God (Psalm 62:8). Make it personal. Let your prayer time be a time of humbling yourself and drawing near to God (James 4:6-8). Remember, “true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father is seeking such people to worship him” (John 4:23). Ask God to help you to learn how to be a true worshiper.

Develop Your Own Prayer Guide

As you learn how to use the Lord's Prayer as your pattern for prayer, you may desire to develop your own prayer guide. As you read through the Bible each year, you will find verses that speak to your heart in a special way. Take those verses and turn them into prayer and praise to God.

Cultivate Your Relationship with God

View your prayer time as a means of cultivating your relationship with God. If you use scripture to shape your prayers, you will find that it will change both the way you experience God when you pray and the way you think about him. Most people do not develop a consistent, meaningful prayer life unless they have a structure. Let the Lord's Prayer provide the structure.

SUNDAY

WORSHIP/ADORATION

“Our Father” - Our Relationship with God

Dear Heavenly Father,

The Psalmist asks, “Who shall ascend the hill of the LORD? And who shall stand in his holy place?” (Psalm 24:3). The answer comes back, “He who has clean hands and a pure heart, who does not lift up his soul to what is false and does not swear deceitfully” (Psalm 24:4). Grant that today my hands will be clean and my heart pure. May no deceit or falsehood pass from my lips.

You are a God of truth (Isaiah 65:16) and faithfulness (Deuteronomy 32:4). “Lead me in your truth and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all the day long” (Psalm 25:5).

“Send out your light and your truth; let them lead me; let them bring me to your holy hill and to your dwelling!” (Psalm 43:3).

It is your will that I not only speak the truth, but that I am truthful in my inward being (Psalm 51:6, Psalm 15:2). Help me to be completely truthful today in a kind, loving, and considerate manner.

“Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, O LORD, my rock and my redeemer” (Psalm 19:14).

I thank you Lord Jesus, that you are from above and not of this world (John 8:23).

You are the good Shepherd who laid down your life for the sheep (John 10:11). You know your sheep and your sheep know your voice and follow you (John 10:27).

Help me as one of your sheep to listen to you and obey your voice. I desire to follow where you lead, for you always lead in paths of righteousness (Psalm 23:3).

You give eternal life to the sheep who faithfully listen to, obey, and follow you. They will never perish, and no one will snatch them out of your hand (John 10:28). Thank you for the spiritual security you provide.

I worship you, Lord Jesus, for you are the resurrection and the life; he that believes in you, though he die, yet shall he live (John 11:25).

You are the true vine, and your Father is the vine-dresser. Every branch in you that does not bear fruit the Father takes away, and every branch that bears fruit the Father prunes, that it may bring forth more fruit (John 15:1-2).

Help me to see the things in my life that need pruning or changing and to not resist or run away from your loving hand, even when it hurts.

Blessed Holy Spirit, thank you for lavishly pouring the love of God into my heart (Romans 5:5).

You are the heavenly gardener of my soul, working to produce fruit in me. May the spiritual fruit of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control grow and develop in my life (Galatians 5:22-23).

Help me to remember that my body is a temple of the Holy Spirit who is in me, whom I have from God, and that I am not my own. I am bought with a price. Therefore I am to glorify God in my body, and in my spirit, which are God's (1 Corinthians 6:19-20).

Grant that I will glorify you in my body, by the way I dress it and use it, and in my spirit, by the way I think and express myself.

Galatians 5:25 says, "If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit." Please help me to be sensitive and obedient to your leadership.

"In Heaven" - God's Royalty

The Psalmist said, "He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High will abide in the shadow of the Almighty" (Psalm 91:1).

Because you are the King of kings, with infinite knowledge and power, I have no reason to fear the future.

LORD, you are "My refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust." (Psalm 91:2).

You deliver me from the snare of the fowler and from the deadly pestilence (Psalm 91:3).

You will cover me with your pinions, and under your wings I will find refuge; your faithfulness is a shield and buckler (Psalm 91:4).

I know whom I have believed, and I am convinced that you are able to guard what I have entrusted to you until the day of your appearing (2 Timothy 1:12).

“Hallowed Be Your Name” - God’s Reputation

Heavenly Father, you said, “Whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God” (1 Corinthians 10:31).

Your glory is the sublime display of your unique attributes and perfections. Grant that my life may bring you glory as I walk with you today.

May I do nothing that will profane your holy name (Leviticus 22:32).

Make me holy as you are holy.

INTERCESSION

“Your Kingdom Come” - God’s Reign

God’s plan from eternity has been to establish a kingdom of righteousness and holiness upon the earth (Matthew 25:34). The establishment of God’s kingdom happens in two phases. The first phase is spiritual. God rules in the hearts and lives of his people (Colossians 1:13). When we pray “your kingdom come,” we are praying that people will get saved and become citizens of God’s kingdom (Matthew 9:35). The second phase of the kingdom’s coming is physical. When Jesus comes the second time, he will abolish all the governments of the earth, and establish himself as King of the whole world (Daniel 2:44-45). When we pray “your kingdom come,” in this sense, we are eagerly anticipating Jesus’ second coming (Revelation 22:20).

“Righteousness and justice are the foundation of your throne; steadfast love and faithfulness go before you” (Psalm 89:14).

All that you do is right and just. Although I may not understand why you allow certain things to happen in my life, may I always remember that you are too loving to be cruel and too wise to make a mistake.

“My mouth will speak the praise of the LORD, and let all flesh bless his holy name forever and ever” (Psalm 145:21).

May your kingdom come!

Bless, strengthen, and encourage all the preachers, missionaries, teachers, pastors, and evangelists—all that labor for you throughout the world.

Lord, you are not slow to fulfill your promise as some count slowness, but you are patient toward all, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance (2 Peter 3:9).

I pray for... (*names of people who are not saved*)... to be saved.

Please bring people into their lives who will help them know how to be saved (Romans 10:13-14).

Bind the powers of darkness that hold them captive (Matthew 12:28-29) and open their eyes to their need of you (Acts 26:18).

“Your Will Be Done, on Earth as It Is in Heaven” - God’s Rule

You have saved me, and called me to a holy calling, not because of my works but because of your own purpose and grace, which you gave me in Christ Jesus before the ages began (2 Timothy 1:9).

It is your will that I align my life to your holy Word. Grant me the grace to live in obedience to all you have shown me. You said that if I walk in the light, as you are in the light, I have fellowship with other believers, and the blood of Jesus your Son cleanses me from all sin (1 John 1:7).

May I never turn back from walking in all the light and thereby bring you pain (Psalm 78:14-17).

Like Paul, I choose to “count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord” (Philippians 3:8). May I always choose you and your will instead of my own will and desires.

SUPPLICATION

“Give Us This Day Our Daily Bread” - God’s Resources for Us

Dear Father, you said that if I seek first your kingdom and your righteousness—if I put you first in my life—you will supply all my material needs (Matthew 6:33).

Help me to remember that one of the ways I put you first in my life is to give back to you the tithe (10%) of my earnings (Leviticus 27:30). I do this, Lord, to acknowledge my trust in you and dependence on you as my provider.

If I fail to honor you with my tithe, you tell me I am robbing you of that which rightfully belongs to you (Malachi 3:8). You warn me that if I don’t tithe, you

will allow the devourer to consume my income (Malachi 3:11).

Help me to be faithful to obey you in my finances.

Father, please forgive me for ever murmuring or complaining about my circumstances (1 Corinthians 10:10).

I know that nothing touches my life unless it first passes through your hand (Colossians 3:3). Help me to trust you with all I am and all I have. You have been better to me than I deserve.

Forgive me, also, for worrying about material and physical problems (Matthew 6:31).

I thank you for your promise to supply every one of my needs according to your riches in glory in Christ Jesus (Philippians 4:19).

I pray for... *(your present needs)*.

Help me to remember and be thankful for all you have already done!

I pray for... *(others who are in need around the world)*.

I pray for those who occupy positions in local, state, and national government. I pray that you would guide them by the principles of your Word. Grant that they would honor you and that righteousness would reign. Please frustrate the purposes of evil and may your will be done. Grant “that we may lead a peaceful and

quiet life, godly and dignified in every way” (1 Timothy 2:2).

CONFESSION/RECONCILIATION

“And Forgive Us Our Debts, as We Also Have Forgiven Our Debtors” - Reconciliation with God

The Psalmist said, “I acknowledged my sin to you, and I did not cover my iniquity; I said, ‘I will confess my transgressions to the LORD,’ and you forgave the iniquity of my sin” (Psalm 32:5).

Lord, help me to not allow bitterness against anyone to poison the soil of my soul, for you have said that if any root of bitterness grows up in my heart, many people may be defiled (Hebrews 12:15).

If there is anyone I have not treated with the kindness and genuine love of Christ, please bring them to my remembrance and give me the courage and grace to humble myself and ask for their forgiveness.

You said that you oppose the proud but give grace to the humble (James 4:6). Enable me to humble myself so I can receive your grace.

SPIRITUAL WARFARE

“And Lead Us Not into Temptation, but Deliver Us from Evil” - God’s Protection

You said, “Share in suffering as a good soldier of Christ Jesus. No soldier gets entangled in civilian pursuits, since his aim is to please the one who enlisted him” (2 Timothy 2:3-4).

Jesus is my commanding officer. Help me to obey all his commands.

Grant that today, Father, I may be spiritually strong in you.

This is your will for me: “Be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might.... For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood [people], but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places” (Ephesians 6:10, 12).

Help me, Father, to put on the whole armor of God, so that in the day of evil, I may be able to stand my ground spiritually (Ephesians 6:13).

PRAISE AND THANKSGIVING

“For Yours Is the Kingdom and the Power and the Glory, Forever” - Praise to God

“Yours, O LORD, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the victory and the majesty, for all that

is in the heavens and in the earth is yours. Yours is the kingdom, O LORD, and you are exalted as head above all” (1 Chronicles 29:11).

“I will rejoice and be glad in your steadfast love, because you have seen my affliction; you have known the distress of my soul” (Psalm 31:7).

You said, “Be strong, and let your heart take courage, all you who wait for the LORD!” (Psalm 31:24).

LORD, bless me and keep me. Make your face shine upon me and be gracious to me. Lift up your countenance upon me and give me peace (Numbers 6:24-26).

This is the confidence I have toward you, that if I ask anything according to your will you hear me. And I know that if you hear me in whatever I ask, I know that I have the requests that I have asked of you (1 John 5:14-15).

In the name of Jesus I pray this, Amen.

MONDAY

WORSHIP/ADORATION

“Our Father” - Our Relationship with God

Dear Heavenly Father,

I enter into your divine presence in Jesus' name (Ephesians 2:18). I rejoice in the fact that you invite me to have fellowship with you and with your Son, Jesus (1 John 1:3), and with the Holy Spirit (Philippians 2:1).

You invite me to come with confidence to the throne of grace, that I may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need (Hebrews 4:16).

I thank you that you are full of compassion (Psalm 103:13). Lamentations 3:22-23 says, “The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.”

Scripture asks, “Who has ascended to heaven and come down? Who has gathered the wind in his fists? Who has wrapped up the waters in a garment? Who has established all the ends of the earth? What is his name, and what is his son's name? Surely you know!” (Proverbs 30:4).

I praise you Father, that I know that Jesus is your Son. I gladly obey your command to honor the Son, just as I honor the Father (John 5:23).

Lord Jesus, thank you for laying aside the glory you had with the Father before the world was created (John 17:5), and for becoming the Savior of the world (1 John 4:14).

Thank you for loving me so much that you willingly gave yourself to be the atoning sacrifice for my sins, and not for mine only, but also for the sins of the whole world (1 John 2:2).

You were pierced for my transgressions; you were crushed for my iniquities; upon you was the chastisement that brought me peace, and with your wounds I am healed (Isaiah 53:5).

I praise you, Lord Jesus, that you arose from the grave a victor over death and hell (Revelation 1:18). Because of my union with you, I too am dead to sin and have risen to walk in newness of life (Romans 6:4).

I worship you, blessed Holy Spirit.

Fill me anew with your holy presence (Ephesians 5:18).

You comfort (Acts 9:31), strengthen (Ephesians 3:16) and lead (Romans 8:14) each person who desires to please God. Help me to know how to cooperate with you.

You also “convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment” (John 16:8).

Teach me to submit to your leadership in every area of my life (Galatians 5:24).

Cleanse me from all that would hinder your work in my life. May I not grieve you today in any way (Ephesians 4:30).

“In Heaven” - God’s Royalty

Heaven is a place. It is where God’s throne is located. Yet we are not to think of God’s presence as limited to heaven. He is omnipresent (“everywhere present” - Psalm 139:7-12). However, God is said to be more present some places than others. The fact that God is in heaven signifies that he is not limited to earthly resources. He is sovereign and has unlimited resources. Further, “heaven” speaks of perfection and reminds me that God is the perfection of Fatherhood.

Heavenly Father, I praise you: You have established your throne in the heavens, and your kingdom rules over all (Psalm 103:19).

You are “God in heaven above and on the earth beneath; there is no other” (Deuteronomy 4:39).

To you, the LORD my God, "...belong heaven and the heaven of heavens, the earth with all that is in it" (Deuteronomy 10:14). "Behold, heaven and the highest heaven cannot contain you" (1 Kings 8:27).

"Look down from your holy habitation, from heaven, and bless your people" (Deuteronomy 26:15).

Father, you said that those who keep your testimonies and seek you with their whole heart are blessed (Psalm 119:2).

"With my whole heart I seek you; let me not wander from your commandments! I have stored up your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you" (Psalm 119:10-11).

You are the royal King of heaven and the King of my life.

"Hallowed Be Your Name" - God's Reputation

The very nature of God (all that God is and does) is holy. We claim to have a relationship with God through Jesus Christ. Because God is holy, we must be holy in all our attitudes and actions (1 Peter 1:15-16). We influence what others think about him. His reputation is in our hands.

Father, all that you are, and all that you do is holy. “Who is like you, majestic in holiness, awesome in glorious deeds, doing wonders” (Exodus 15:11).

“For thus says the One who is high and lifted up, who inhabits eternity, whose name is Holy: I dwell in the high and holy place, and also with him who is of a contrite and lowly spirit, to revive the spirit of the lowly, and to revive the heart of the contrite” (Isaiah 57:15).

Help me to be contrite and humble so that your holy presence will dwell with me and revive my heart.

Father, help me to live today in such a manner that will not detract from your holiness. Your reputation is in my hands since I claim to follow Christ. May I not bring a reproach on your holy name by anything I do or say.

May people see your holiness—Christlike attitudes and actions—shining forth from my life, for you command me, “as he who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct” (1 Peter 1:15).

INTERCESSION

“Your Kingdom Come” - God’s Reign

“The LORD reigns, let the earth rejoice” (Psalm 97:1).

“The LORD reigns; let the peoples tremble! He sits enthroned upon the cherubim; let the earth quake!” (Psalm 99:1).

Father, I worship you and praise you, for you are Sovereign! You reign supreme over all the nations of the earth. To you “...the nations are like a drop from a bucket, and are accounted as the dust on the scales” (Isaiah 40:15).

May your kingdom come! May your kingdom grow as more and more people come to know you as their Lord and Savior.

Bless, strengthen, and encourage all the preachers who work for you in various ministries throughout the world.

You said, “Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes, and see that the fields are white for harvest” (John 4:35).

Help me to do what I can to lead others to you. I pray that more people will hear your call and become laborers in the harvest (Matthew 9:38).

You promised, “Call to me and I will answer you, and will tell you great and hidden things that you have not known” (Jeremiah 33:3).

“Will you not revive us again: that your people may rejoice in you?” (Psalm 85:6).

I pray for... (*names of people who are not saved*)... to be saved.

Father, draw them to Jesus (John 6:44). Grant them a heart of repentance (2 Timothy 2:25). Create in them a hunger and thirst for you (John 6:35).

Oh God, as long as they are happy in sin, they will not sense their need for you. Therefore, cause the pleasures of sin to turn to gravel in their mouths (Proverbs 20:17). Hedge them in to your will and your way (Hosea 2:6).

Please bring people into their lives who will help them know how to be saved (Romans 10:13-14).

Bind the powers of darkness that hold them captive (2 Timothy 2:26) and open their eyes to their need of you (2 Corinthians 4:4).

May the day of their salvation be soon.

God’s Rule**

Father, help me to be attentive to your word so that I will know your will. You express your will through scripture.

Help my will to be submissive to your will. If there is anything in my life that is not pleasing you, please show it to me and give me the ability to make whatever changes you want made.

It is your will that I live with integrity and do what is right. You require me to speak truth in my heart (Psalm 15:2).

I am not to say things about others that would damage their character or influence, nor am I to speak evil of

my neighbors (Proverbs 11:9). I am not to take up a reproach against my friend (Psalm 15:3).

Place a guard on my tongue so that I please you in all I say (Psalm 141:3).

I don't want to do anything contrary to your will. May your will truly be done in my life today.

SUPPLICATION

“Give Us This Day Our Daily Bread” - God's Resources for Us

Dear Father, you said that if I seek first your kingdom and your righteousness—if I put you first in my life—you will supply all my material needs (Matthew 6:33).

Jesus, you said, “Do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble” (Matthew 6:34).

You forbid me to grumble, murmur, or complain about anything (1 Corinthians 10:10).

Please forgive me for ever murmuring or complaining about my circumstances. You have been better to me than I deserve.

If I suffer financial reverses, help me to remember that Jesus had no place to lay his head (Matthew 8:20), but he was rich in his relationship with you.

Grant that as I pray and read your Word, I too will be rich in my relationship with you.

Forgive me for worrying.

You tell me in Philippians 4:6-7, “Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.”

I thank you for your promise to supply every one of my needs according to your riches in glory in Christ Jesus (Philippians 4:19).

I thank you for all the blessings you have given me in the past.

I bring you my present needs.... *(name them)*.

Help me to remember and be thankful for all you have already done!

I pray for... *(people who are in need around the world)*.

I pray for those who occupy positions in local, state, and national government. I pray that you would guide them by the principles of your Word. Grant that they would honor you and that righteousness would reign. Please frustrate the purposes of evil and may your will be done. CONFESSION/RECONCILIATION

“And Forgive Us Our Debts, as We Also Have Forgiven Our Debtors” - Reconciliation with God

“Search me, O God, and know my heart! Try me and know my thoughts! And see if there be any grievous way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting” (Psalm 139:23-24).

We are to submit to the authority of his Word.

Fill me today, blessed Spirit, with your holy presence (Ephesians 5:18). Teach me to submit to your control over every area of my life.

Cleanse me from all that would hinder your work in my life (2 Corinthians 7:1).

May I not grieve you today in any way (Ephesians 4:30).

CONFESSION/RECONCILIATION

“And Forgive Us Our Debts, as We Also Have Forgiven Our Debtors” - Reconciliation with God

Confession is an act of self-humbling. It is an acknowledgement of the need of God's grace and help. Properly offered, it expresses the desire for spiritual improvement. Confession is to adopt God's viewpoint and attitude toward what is wrong or needs to be changed in your life. Confession assumes personal responsibility for your choices and attitudes regardless of how other people treated you.

“Search me, O God, and know my heart! Try me and know my thoughts! And see if there be any grievous way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting!” (Psalm 139:23-24).

Jesus, you said, “Whenever you stand praying, forgive, if you have anything against anyone, so that your Father also who is in heaven may forgive you your trespasses” (Mark 11:25).

Father, bring to my mind anyone I have not forgiven.

Grant me the grace to forgive each person who has sinned against me or hurt me or those I care about.

Cleanse me of all bitterness, ill-will, or resentment toward them.

Father, I confess my need to have a closer walk with you and to develop a prompt obedience to the prompting and checks of the Spirit.

You said that I am to examine everything carefully and to hold fast only to that which is good (1 Thessalonians 5:21).

I am to abstain from every form of evil (1 Thessalonians 5:22).

I am to allow you, God of peace, to sanctify me entirely (completely, every part) and to preserve my whole spirit and soul and body blameless until the coming of my Lord Jesus Christ. You call me to be entirely sanctified, and you are faithful; you will entirely sanctify me if I cooperate with you (1 Thessalonians 5:23-24). May the entirely sanctified life be mine each day as I remain fully surrendered to your will.

“Give Us This Day Our Daily Bread” - God’s Resources for Us

Dear Father, Colossians 3:1 says, “If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God.” I am to set my mind on things that are above, not on things that are on earth (Colossians 3:2). Help me to do this.

Father, please forgive me for ever murmuring or complaining about my circumstances. You have been better to me than I deserve.

I thank you for your promise to supply every one of my needs according to your riches in glory in Christ Jesus (Philippians 4:19).

I thank you for the emotional, mental, physical, and spiritual health with which you have blessed me.

I pray for... *(whatever you feel you need that is within God’s will for you).*

CONFESSION/RECONCILIATION

“And Forgive Us Our Debts, as We Also Have Forgiven Our Debtors” - Reconciliation with God

Father, James 3:2 reminds me, “We all stumble in many ways. And if anyone does not stumble in what he says, he is a perfect man, able also to bridle his whole body.”

My tongue is a little member of my body, but it can do enormous damage. You said the tongue is like a fire (James 3:5-6). Help me not to use my tongue in harmful ways or ways that displease you.

You tell us, “Confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working” (James 5:16).

Father, I confess my need to have a greater sensitivity toward other people and a greater ability to express Christ’s love to them.

I thank you, Father, that you are good, and forgiving, abounding in steadfast love to all who call upon you (Psalm 86:5). Thank you for forgiving my sin.

I join with the Psalmist and proclaim, “Bless the LORD, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless his holy name! Bless the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits, who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases, who redeems your life from the pit, who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy, who

satisfies you with good so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's" (Psalm 103:1-5).

SPIRITUAL WARFARE

“And Lead Us Not into Temptation, but Deliver Us from Evil” - God’s Protection

LORD, help me to trust in you with all my heart and stop leaning on my own understanding. Help me in all my ways to know you (your mind—how you think about each situation I face) and to walk in your ways today. You promised that if I do this, you will make my paths straight (Proverbs 3:5-6).

May I have the wisdom that is from above: wisdom that is first pure, then peaceable, gentle (considerate), open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial and sincere (James 3:17).

You said, “Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God” (Matthew 5:8). Grant that my thoughts and motives be pure today in your sight.

I am to put on the helmet of salvation (Ephesians 6:17). May all my thoughts be taken captive to obey Jesus Christ (2 Corinthians 10:5). Help me to quickly detect the thoughts the enemy places in my mind and to flee to the blood of Jesus for protection (Revelation 12:11).

Grant that I learn how to use the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God (Ephesians 6:17). May I

store up your word in my heart so that I will not sin against you (Psalm 119:11).

PRAISE AND THANKSGIVING

“For Yours Is the Kingdom and the Power and the Glory, Forever” - Praise to God

Focus on the position of God, his power, his majesty, and his glory. Encourage your heart with praise.

“Yours, O LORD, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the victory and the majesty, for all that is in the heavens and in the earth is yours. Yours is the kingdom, O LORD, and you are exalted as head above all” (1 Chronicles 29:11).

“You bless the righteous, O LORD; you cover him with favor as with a shield” (Psalm 5:12).

LORD, I have set you always before me; because you are at my right hand, I shall not be shaken (Psalm 16:8).

You have heard my plea; you accept my prayer (Psalm 6:9).

“Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, to him be glory in the church and

in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen” (Ephesians 3:20-21).
